Don Beads appeals the district court's order granting Defendants summary judgment on Beads' race discrimination claims, brought pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000e to 2000e-17 (2012), 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2012), and Article 24 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights.
