PER CURIAM:

Kareem Brown appeals the district court's order denying his motion for an extension of time to appeal his criminal judgment. Upon review, we conclude that the district court correctly determined that it was unable to extend the time for filing a timely notice of appeal of the criminal judgment because Brown filed his motion after the expiration of the excusable neglect period. *See* Fed. R. App. P. 4(b)(4). Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. *United States v. Brown*, No. 4:17-cr-00113-MSD-RJK-1 (E.D. Va. July 18, 2019). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
