Thomas Bray appeals the district court's¹ grant of summary judgment to defendants in his quiet title action, removed to federal court based on diversity jurisdiction, and the court's grant of summary judgment to defendants on their counterclaim seeking foreclosure. Following careful de novo review, see Linn Farms and Timber Ltd. P'ship v. Union Pac. R.R. Co., 661 F.3d 354, 357 (8th Cir. 2011), we conclude that defendants were entitled to summary judgment, both in Bray's action and on their counterclaim, for the reasons given by the district court. We also find no abuse of discretion in the court's ruling on Bray's discovery and recusal motions. Accordingly, the judgment is affirmed. See 8th Cir. R. 47B.
