PER CURIAM.

Arkansas inmate Paul Gordon appeals the district court's¹ adverse grant of summary judgment in his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 action, in which he claimed that court reporter Leca Ledbetter had altered transcripts of the hearings in several of Gordon's state court proceedings. Upon careful de novo review, <u>see Jones v. Frost</u>, 770 F.3d 1183, 1185 (8th Cir. 2014), <u>cert. denied</u>, 135 S. Ct. 2315 (2015), we conclude that summary judgment was proper because, as explained by the district court, the record contains no explanation as to how the alleged alterations affected the outcome of any of the proceedings at issue, <u>see Tedford v. Hepting</u>, 990 F.2d 745, 747 (3d Cir. 1993); <u>Colyer v. Ryles</u>, 827 F.2d 315, 316 (8th Cir. 1987) (per curiam). Accordingly, we affirm. <u>See</u> 8th Cir. R. 47B.
