## PER CURIAM.

Jonathan Vineyard, an Arkansas correctional officer, appeals the decision denying summary judgment on Deverick Scott's First Amendment retaliation claim. Having carefully reviewed the record and the arguments that we can consider in this interlocutory appeal, *see Heartland Acad. Cmty. Church v. Waddle*, 595 F.3d 798, 804, 807 (8th Cir. 2010) (explaining that our review is de novo, but we cannot consider sufficiency-of-the-evidence challenges), we agree with the district court<sup>1</sup> that genuine issues of material fact exist, *see Garcia v. City of Trenton*, 348 F.3d 726, 729 (8th Cir. 2003) (looking to whether a person of "ordinary firmness" would have been chilled); *Irving v. Dormire*, 519 F.3d 441, 451 (8th Cir. 2008) (recognizing that causing a prisoner to be seen as a "snitch" puts him "in danger of being assaulted or killed by other inmates"). We accordingly affirm. *See* 8th Cir. R. 47B.
