In these consolidated appeals, Julio Bayron-Arriola appeals his guilty-plea

conviction and 46-month sentence for reentry of a removed alien, in violation of 8

U.S.C. § 1326, and the revocation of supervised release and consecutive 8-month

sentence imposed upon revocation. Pursuant to Anders v. California, 386 U.S. 738

(1967), Bayron-Arriola's counsel has filed a brief stating that there are no grounds for relief, along with a motion to withdraw as counsel of record. We have provided Bayron-Arriola the opportunity to file a pro se supplemental brief. No pro se supplemental brief or answering brief has been filed.

Bayron-Arriola waived his right to appeal his conviction, the revocation of supervised release, and his sentences. Our independent review of the record pursuant to *Penson v. Ohio*, 488 U.S. 75, 80 (1988), discloses no arguable issue as to the validity of the waivers. *See United States v. Watson*, 582 F.3d 974, 986-88 (9th Cir. 2009). We accordingly dismiss the appeals. *See id.* at 988.

Counsel's motion to withdraw is **GRANTED**.
