PER CURIAM.

Cathleen E. Golden appeals the final judgment of the United States Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims, which dismissed her appeal from the Board of Veterans' Appeals for lack of jurisdiction based on the failure to timely file a notice of appeal. Golden v. Principi, No. 04-1385 (Vet. App. Mar. 16, 2005). In so doing, the court rejected her equitable tolling argument. We <u>vacate</u> the court's judgment and <u>remand</u> the case for reconsideration in light of <u>Barrett v. Nicholson</u>, 466 F.3d 1038 (Fed. Cir. 2006).
