4	Third, Fourth, Sixth, and Seventh Causes of Action in the First Amended					
5	Complaint ("FAC") in the action. On August 22, 2008, after a bench trial on the					
6	Fifth Cause of Action in the FAC, the Court entered Findings of Fact and					
7	Conclusions of Law, and adjudicated the Fifth Cause of Action in favor of UMG					
8	and against Clinton.					
9	IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED:					
10	1. That final judgment be, and hereby is, entered in favor of UMG, and					
11	against Clinton, on the entirety of the FAC and every cause of action therein;					
12	2. That the FAC be, and hereby is, dismissed with prejudice;					
13	3. That the July 19, 1977, agreement between Casablanca Record and					
14	FilmWorks, Inc. ("Casablanca"), and Thang, Inc. ("Thang") (Trial Exhibit 14); the					
15	October 17, 1980, Release and Settlement Agreement among Thang, Clinton, and					
16	Casablanca (Trial Exhibit 205); the October 23, 1980, Artist's Production					
17	Agreement between Casablanca and P-Funk, Inc. ("P-Funk") (Trial Exhibit 204);					
18	and the December 23, 1980, agreement among P-Funk, Casablanca, and Clinton					
19	(Trial Exhibit 15) are all valid and enforceable agreements that exclusively govern					
20	UMG's relationship with Clinton regarding the artist Parlet;					
21	4. That Defendant UMG Recordings, Inc., which was formerly known as					
22	PolyGram Records, Inc., is the successor-in-interest to the rights of Casablanca					
23	relating to Clinton, including his loan-out companies, and the musical artists					
24	Parliament and Parlet;					
25	5. That Trial Exhibit 14, the July 19, 1977, exclusive recording					
26	agreement between Casablanca and Thang regarding Thang's record production					
27	services for the artist Parlet, contains the operative royalty and other payment					

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terms between UMG and Clinton's loan-out companies concerning the Parlet

3	6. That UMG is the copyright owner of the Parlet Master Recordings,

6	(Copyright Registration No. SR 23-294), and Best of Parlet (Copyright					
7	Registration No. SR 20-6419), including the individual sound recordings contained
