FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

Plaintiff is a state prisoner proceeding pro se. On July 9, 2007, the United States District Court for the Central District of California transferred plaintiff's May 1, 2007 complaint to this court. Due to the duplicative nature of the present action, the court will recommend that the complaint be dismissed.
