FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

By an order filed April 1, 2011, this court ordered plaintiff to complete and return to the court, within sixty days, the USM-285 form necessary to effect service on defendant T. Kimura. and Recommendations." Any response to the objections shall be filed and served within fourteen days after service of the objections. Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
