25	fourteen days after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file
26	written objections with the court. A document containing objections should be titled "Objections
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to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file
 objections within the specified time may, under certain circumstances, waive the right to appeal
 the District Court's order. <u>See Martinez v. Ylst</u>, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
