Upon remand, the Appeals Council will direct the administrative law judge 22 to further consider whether Plaintiff's IQ scores in the record, including any IQ scores from any 23 subsequent consultative examination or other examination(s), meets or equals Listing 12.05C; and 24 if the ALJ finds that Plaintiff does not meet or equal Listing 12.05C or any other listing, evaluate 25 all of the evidence of record and make a residual functional capacity (RFC) finding, explaining 26 the basis for the RFC and citing the evidence supporting it. 27 28 Stip. & Order for Remand 1

1	The parties stipulate that no specific aspect of the ALJ's prior decision is affirmed.
2	The parties further request that the Clerk of the Court be directed to enter a final judgment
3	in favor of Plaintiff, and against Defendant, Commissioner of Social Security, reversing the final
4	decision of the Commissioner. Nothing in this proposed order shall be taken to affect Plaintiff's
5	right to request Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA) attorney's fees under 28 U.S.C. § 2412, or
6	costs under 28 U.S.C. § 1920, or to prevent Defendant from opposing any such requests.
