16	By an order filed January 19, 2011, plaintiff was ordered to file a completed in
17	forma pauperis affidavit and a certified copy of his prison trust account statement within thirty
18	days and was cautioned that failure to do so would result in a recommendation that this action be
19	dismissed. The thirty day period has now expired, and plaintiff has not responded to the court's
20	order.
21	Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court assign a
22	district court judge to this case; and
23	IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without
24	prejudice.
25	These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District
26	Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen
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1	days after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party may file written
2	objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a document should be captioned
3	"Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Any reply to the objections
4	shall be served and filed within fourteen days after service of the objections. The parties are
5	advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the
6	District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
