FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS 14 15 On May 31, 2012, the court ordered petitioner to file an in forma pauperis 16 17 affidavit or pay the required filing fee within thirty days. The court cautioned petitioner that failure to do so would result in the dismissal of this action. The thirty day period has now 18 expired, and petitioner has not responded to the court's order. 19 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is directed to 20 21 randomly assign a United States District Judge to this action. 22 IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without 23 prejudice. 2.4 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District 25 Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days after being served with these findings and recommendations, petitioner may file written 26

objections with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Petitioner is advised that failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. Martinez v. Ylst, 951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
