The twenty-eight day period has long 22 since expired, and plaintiff has not responded to the court's order in any manner. Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without 23 24 prejudice. See Local Rule 110; FED. R. CIV. P. 41(b). These findings and recommendations will be submitted to the United States District Judge 25 26 assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days 27 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 28 with the court. A document containing objections should be titled "Objections to Magistrate

1	Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within
2	the specified time may waive the right to appeal the District Court's order. See Martinez v. Ylst,
3	951 F.2d 1153 (9th Cir. 1991).
