The thirty-day period has now expired, and 20 plaintiff has not responded to the court's order and has not filed an in forma pauperis affidavit or 21 paid the appropriate filing fee.¹ 22 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court is directed to randomly assign a United States District Judge to this action. 23 24 IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. 25 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge 26 Although it appears from the file that plaintiff's copy of the court's order was returned, plaintiff was properly served. It is the plaintiff's responsibility to keep the court apprised of her current 27 address at all times.
