The thirty day 21 period has now expired, and plaintiff has not filed an affidavit or paid the filing fee. 22 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. P. 41(b). 23 24 These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(l). Within fourteen days 25 26 after being served with these findings and recommendations, plaintiff may file written objections 27 with the court. The document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings

and Recommendations." Plaintiff is advised that failure to file objections within the specified
