Plaintiff submitted a request to proceed in forma pauperis (ECF No. 2); however, it was 19 incomplete. On April 21, 2016, the court ordered him to file both a completed affidavit in 20 support of his request to proceed in forma pauperis and a certified copy of his prison trust account 21 statement within thirty days, or face dismissal of this action. (ECF No. 4.) The thirty day period 22 has now expired, and plaintiff has not submitted the required documents. Thus the undersigned will recommend that this action be dismissed without prejudice. 23 24 Accordingly, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that: 1. The Clerk of Court shall assign a district judge to this action. 25 26 IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED that this action be dismissed without prejudice. See 27 Local Rule 110; Fed. R. Civ. P. 41(b). //// 28 1
