That a final judgment be entered, forfeiting all right, title, and interest in the defendant funds to the United States, to be disposed of according to law; 5. That the Default Judgment and Final Judgment of Forfeiture lodged herein be signed by the Honorable Kimberly J. Mueller and filed by the Clerk of the Court. These findings and recommendations are submitted to the United States District Judge assigned to the case, pursuant to the provisions of 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1). Within fourteen days after being served with these findings and recommendations, any party may file written objections with the court and serve a copy on all parties. Such a document should be captioned "Objections to Magistrate Judge's Findings and Recommendations." Failure to file objections within the specified time may waive the
