1 The Securities and Exchange Commission having filed a Complaint and Defendant Guolin  
2 Ma having entered a general appearance; consented to the Court's jurisdiction over Defendant and  
3 the subject matter of this action; consented to entry of this Final Judgment without admitting or  
4 denying the allegations of the Complaint (except as to jurisdiction and except as otherwise provided  
5 herein in Paragraph V); waived findings of fact and conclusions of law; and waived any right to  
6 appeal from this Final Judgment:

7 I.

8 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant and Defendant's  
9 agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all persons in active concert or participation with them  
10 who receive actual notice of this Final Judgment by personal service or otherwise are permanently  
11 restrained and enjoined from violating, directly or indirectly, Section 10(b) of the Securities  
12 Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Exchange Act") [15 U.S.C. § 78j(b)] and Rule 10b-5 promulgated  
13 thereunder [17 C.F.R. § 240.10b-5], by using any means or instrumentality of interstate commerce, or  
14 of the mails, or of any facility of any national securities exchange, in connection with the purchase or  
15 sale of any security:

- 16 (a) to employ any device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
- 17 (b) to make any untrue statement of a material fact or to omit to state a material fact  
18 necessary in order to make the statements made, in the light of the circumstances  
19 under which they were made, not misleading; or
- 20 (c) to engage in any act, practice, or course of business which operates or would  
21 operate as a fraud or deceit upon any person.

22 II.

23 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that Defendant is liable for  
24 disgorgement of \$367,387, representing profits gained as a result of the conduct alleged in the  
25 Complaint, together with prejudgment interest thereon in the amount of \$21,986, and a civil monetary  
26 penalty of \$367,387. Defendant shall satisfy this obligation by paying \$756,760 to the Securities and  
27 Exchange Commission.

1 Defendant may transmit payment electronically to the Commission, which will provide  
2 detailed ACH transfer/Fedwire instructions upon request. Payment may also be made directly from  
3 a bank account via Pay.gov through the SEC website at <http://www.sec.gov/about/offices/ofm.htm>.  
4 Defendant may also pay by certified check, bank cashier's check, or United States postal money  
5 order payable to the Securities and Exchange Commission, which shall be delivered or mailed to

10 and shall be accompanied by a letter identifying the case title, civil action number, and name of this  
11 Court; Guolin Ma as a defendant in this action; and specifying that payment is made pursuant to this  
12 Final Judgment.

13 Defendant shall simultaneously transmit photocopies of evidence of payment and case  
14 identifying information to the Commission's counsel in this action. By making the payment,  
15 Defendant relinquishes all legal and equitable right, title, and interest in such funds and no part of the  
16 funds shall be returned to Defendant. The Commission shall send the funds paid pursuant to this  
17 Final Judgment to the United States Treasury.

18 The Commission may enforce the Court's judgment for disgorgement and prejudgment  
19 interest by moving for civil contempt (and/or through other collection procedures authorized by law)  
20 at any time after 14 days following entry of this Final Judgment if Defendant fails to comply with the  
21 terms of this Final Judgment. Defendant shall pay post-judgment interest on any unpaid amounts of  
22 disgorgement, prejudgment interest, and penalty due after 14 days of the entry of Final Judgment  
23 pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1961.

### 24 III.

25 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that, for purposes of exceptions  
26 to discharge set forth in Section 523 of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §523, the allegations in the  
27 Complaint are true and admitted by Defendant, and further, any debt for disgorgement, prejudgment  
28 interest, civil penalty or other amounts due by Defendant under this Final Judgment or any other

1 judgment, order, consent order, decree or settlement agreement entered in connection with this  
2 proceeding, is a debt for the violation by Defendant of the federal securities laws or any regulation or  
3 order issued under such laws, as set forth in Section 523(a)(19) of the Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C.  
4 §523(a)(19).


5 IV.
