DEFAULT JUDGMENT

This matter is before the Court on the motion of the Plaintiff, Wachovia SBA Lending, Inc. ("Wachovia"), for entry of default judgment, pursuant to Rule 55, Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, against Defendants Howard B. Ball ("Mr. Ball") and Jacqueline D. Ball ("Mrs. Ball"). The Court further finds that no just reason exists to delay entry of this Judgment as a final judgment on Wachovia's claims against Mr. and Mrs. Ball in this action, and, accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that, pursuant to Rule 54(b), Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, this Judgment shall constitute a final judgment on Wachovia's claims against Mr. and

Mrs. Ball in this action.
