¹ In Sherwood v. Stolle, No. 3:23CV84, the Court directed Plaintiff to complete and return an in forma pauperis affidavit form and a consent to collection of fees form within thirty days. Because Plaintiff failed to return either form, by Memorandum Opinion and Order entered on March 27, 2023, the Court dismissed the action. On April 3, 2023, the Court received a completed consent to collection of fees form and an in forma pauperis affidavit. Because Plaintiff returned the forms, it appeared that Plaintiff desired to continue to pursue his claims. The Court directed the Clerk to refile Plaintiff's Complaint as a new civil action. This is the new action.
