PER CURIAM.

Petitioner presents a timely claim of ineffective assistance of appellate counsel. He was charged with first-degree murder and convicted by a jury of

second-degree murder. The initial brief in his direct appeal was filed shortly after this court's decision in <u>Montgomery v. State</u>, 34 Fla. L. Weekly D360 (Fla. 1st DCA Feb. 12, 2009), which held that the giving of the standard jury instruction on manslaughter in a case of this nature was fundamental error. The Florida Supreme Court has approved the decision of this court. <u>See Montgomery v. State</u>, 39 So. 3d 252 (Fla. 2010). The state has responded to this petition and concedes that Hartley is entitled to relief as in <u>Sharpe v. State</u>, 39 So. 3d 342 (Fla. 1st DCA 2010) and <u>Toby v. State</u>, 29 So. 3d 1138 (Fla. 1st DCA 2009). We therefore grant the petition, reverse the murder conviction and sentence, and remand to the trial court for further proceedings.
