PER CURIAM.

We have for review <u>Arias v. State</u>, 35 Fla. L. Weekly D490 (Fla. 3d DCA Feb. 24, 2010), in which the Third District Court of Appeal cited as authority its decision in <u>State v. Jardines</u>, 9 So. 3d 1 (Fla. 3d DCA 2008), <u>quashed</u>, 73 So. 3d 34 (Fla. 2011), <u>cert. granted in part</u>, 132 S. Ct. 995 (2012). At the time the Third District issued its <u>Arias</u> decision, <u>Jardines</u> was pending review in this Court. We have jurisdiction. <u>See</u> art. V, § 3(b)(3), Fla. Const.; <u>Jollie v. State</u>, 405 So. 2d 418 (Fla. 1981).

We stayed proceedings in this case pending our disposition of <u>Jardines v.</u> <u>State</u>, 73 So. 3d 34 (Fla. 2011), <u>cert. granted in part</u>, 132 S. Ct. 995 (2012), in which we ultimately quashed the Third District's underlying <u>Jardines</u> decision. We then issued an order directing respondent in the present case to show cause why we should not accept jurisdiction, quash the Third District's underlying <u>Arias</u> decision, and remand for reconsideration in light of our decision in <u>Jardines</u>.

Upon consideration of the response and petitioner's reply thereto, we have determined to accept jurisdiction and grant the petition for review in the present case. The decision under review is quashed and this matter is remanded to the Third District for reconsideration upon application of this Court's <u>Jardines</u> decision.

It is so ordered.
