Karlin, 68 Haw. 648, 650, 727 P.2d 1127, 1129 (1986) ("[A]n appellant's failure to file a timely notice of appeal is a jurisdictional defect that can neither be waived by the parties nor disregarded by the court in the exercise of judicial discretion.") (cleaned up).
