The district court's June 23, 2014 ruling, which overruled the defendant's declinatory exception raising the objection of improper venue, is reversed, and judgment is hereby rendered sustaining the exception. The plaintiff's survival and wrongful death claims constitute "civil actions with respect to prison conditions," under La. R.S. 15:1181 (2) of the Prison Litigation Reform Act, and therefore, the exclusive venue provision under the Act, La. R.S. 15:1184 (F), governs. The proper venue for this lawsuit is the 33rd Judicial District Court in Allen Parish, Louisiana. The matter is remanded to the 19th Judicial District Court with instructions to either dismiss it, or in the interest of justice, transfer it to the 33rd Judicial District Court, pursuant to La. Code Civ. P. art. 121.
