

WRIT DENIED. The cleansing period in effect on the date of the commission of the offense being enhanced rather than the period in effect at the time of conviction of the predicate offense governs. See **State v. Smith**, 2004-0800 (La. App. 1st Cir. 12/17/04), 897 So.2d 710, 713 n.4. Furthermore, relator's first and fourth claims may not be raised in a motion to correct an illegal sentence because they do not point to a claimed illegal term in the sentence. See **State v. Parker**, 98-0256 (La. 5/8/98), 711 So.2d 694 (per curiam).
