

WRIT DENIED AS MOOT. The records of the Office of the Clerk of Court of Iberville Parish reflect that on October 31, 2016, relator pled guilty and was sentenced in this case. Accordingly, relator's pending writ application is moot. If relator wishes to seek review of the district court's denial of his motion to suppress, he should do so by means of a properly filed appeal, as his plea reserved appellate review of this issue, not pretrial supervisory review. See **State v. Crosby**, 338 So.2d 584 (La. 1976). The motion for appeal must be made no later than sixty days after this Court's action on the writ application.
