App. 4th Cir. 2/3/17), 211 So.3d 528, writs denied, 2017-0383, 2017-0384 Nevertheless, based upon the (La. 3/3/17), 216 So.3d 799. arguments of both parties herein, who rely on matters that were not properly admitted into evidence at the trial court, this court has determined it necessary to remand this matter for a full evidentiary hearing. The trial court's April 23, 2018 judgment is vacated, in part, as to the court's order that defendant, P&S Transportation, LLC, shall appear for its deposition in New Orleans. This matter is remanded to the trial court for an evidentiary hearing on the issue of the place where the corporate deposition of defendant, P&S Transportation, LLC, shall be conducted.
