EXHIBIT A

Rules of the Mississippi Commission on Judicial Performance

Rule 6. Probable Cause

B. Disposition. The Commission shall dispose of the case in one (1) of the following ways:

...

(2) If it fails to find grounds for discipline under Section 177A of the Mississippi Constitution, but nevertheless finds that there has been ~~misconduct~~ conduct for which a private admonishment constitutes an adequate ~~discipline~~ response, it shall issue the admonishment. The complainant shall be notified that the matter has been resolved. The Commission shall notify the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of its action.
