- 2 Appellant seeks reversal of a judgment committing him as a mentally ill
- 3 person for a period not to exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. Appellant argues that the
- 4 record does not establish by clear and convincing evidence that he is a danger to others or
- 5 unable to provide for his basic needs because of a mental disorder. See ORS
- 6 426.005(1)(e). The state concedes that the evidence is legally insufficient for involuntary
- 7 commitment and that the judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's
- 8 concession, and reverse.
