- 3 person for a period not to exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. Appellant argues that,
- 4 contrary to the trial court's ruling, the record does not establish by clear and convincing
- 5 evidence that she is a danger to herself because of a mental disorder. See ORS
- 6 426.005(1)(e). The state concedes that the evidence is legally insufficient for involuntary
- 7 commitment and that the judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's
- 8 concession, and reverse.
