### PER CURIAM

2 Appellant seeks reversal of a judgment committing him as a mentally ill person for a period not to exceed 180 days. ORS 426.130. He contends, among other 3 things, that the state failed to establish, by clear and convincing evidence, that, because of 4 a mental disorder, he was a danger to others. ORS 426.005(1)(e). The state concedes 5 6 that the evidence is legally insufficient to support the involuntary commitment and that 7 the judgment should be reversed. We agree, accept the state's concession, and reverse on that basis. Accordingly, we do not address appellant's other assignments of error.<sup>1</sup> 8 9 Reversed.
