## <u>ORDER</u>

PER CURIAM DECIDED: May 1, 2014

**REVERSED**. The Commonwealth Court erred in applying <u>nunc pro tunc</u> constructs to excuse what it perceived to be a non-negligent failure to timely file a statement of financial interests with the Ethics Commission, as required by Section 1104(b)(1) of the Ethics Act. <u>See</u> 65 Pa.C.S. §1104(b)(1). The untimely filing of the statement constitutes a fatal defect that precludes a candidate's appearance on the ballot. <u>See</u> 65 Pa.C.S. §1104(b)(3) ("Failure to file the statement in accordance with the provisions of this chapter shall, in addition to any other penalties provided, be a fatal defect to a petition to appear on the ballot."); <u>In re Nomination of Paulmier</u>, 937 A.2d 364, 371 (Pa. 2007) ("[W]e now hold that the fatality rule announced in Section 1104 of the Ethics Act was intended by the Legislature to bar only those candidates from the ballot who fail to

file statements of financial interests <u>or who file them in an untimely manner</u>.") (emphasis added).

It is further **ORDERED** that Robert Guzzardi's name is to be **STRICKEN** from the primary ballot for the Republican Party nomination for the Office of Governor of Pennsylvania.
