<u>ORDER</u>

Relator has filed a motion for leave to file an application for a writ of mandamus pursuant to the original jurisdiction of this Court. In it, he contends that he filed an application for a writ of habeas corpus in the 410th District Court of Montgomery County, that more than 35 days have elapsed, and that the application has not yet been forwarded to this Court. Relator contends that the district court entered an order designating issues on November 9, 2011.

Respondent, the Judge of the 410th District Court of Montgomery County, shall file a response with this Court by having the District Clerk submit the record on such habeas corpus

Respondent's answer shall be submitted within 30 days of the date of this order. This application
