MEMORANDUM OPINION

On April 23, 2010, Relator, Brian K. McPherson, filed two petitions for writ of mandamus in this Court. *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann §22.221 (Vernon 2004); *see also* Tex. R. App. P. 52.1.

This Court's mandamus jurisdiction is governed by section 22.221 of the Texas Government Code. Section 22.221 expressly limits the mandamus jurisdiction of the courts of appeals to: (1) writs against a district court judge or county court judge in the court of appeals' district, and (2) all writs necessary to enforce the court of appeals' jurisdiction. Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 22.221 (Vernon 2004). Because the petitions for writ of mandamus are directed toward a district court outside of this court's district and is

not necessary to enforce this court's jurisdiction, we have no jurisdiction.¹ *See* Tex. Gov't Code Ann. § 22.221(b)(1).

Accordingly, the petitions for writ of mandamus are ordered dismissed.
