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VERTEFEUILLE, J., with whom, SULLIVAN, C. J., joins, dissenting. I join Justice Katz' dissent because the United States Supreme Court recently concluded in *Georgia v. Randolph*, U.S. , 126 S. Ct. 1515, 1536, 164 L. Ed. 2d 208 (2006), that under the federal constitution, an alleged consent to the search of a home conducted in the face of an objection from a joint occupant who is present at the scene is illegal. It is therefore unnecessary to decide this issue under our state constitution.
