Dear Counsel:

Petitioner seeks to quash a subpoena under both Rule 45(c)(3) of this Court and 6 Del. C. §§ 2514-17.1 However, the rule and statute referenced contemplate a subpoena authorized by a court, which is not the case here.² This Court therefore lacks statutory jurisdiction over the matter. Because Petitioner is free to seek identical relief at law, traditional equitable jurisdiction is also lacking.

Accordingly, the petition is dismissed without prejudice with the understanding that a similar filing will be made in Superior Court.
