The cases Hodgson cites in his reply brief discuss generally the principle of <u>judicial</u> deference to decisions made within a public safety organization. They do not stand for the proposition that a court should instruct a jury regarding this principle. The reason for this is obvious: juries should not be engaging in <u>Pickering</u> balancing in the first place.
