## **ORDER AND JUDGMENT\***

Asiel Rodriguez pleaded guilty to one count of conspiracy to possess counterfeit access devices. The district court sentenced him to 48 months in prison. Although Mr. Rodriguez's plea agreement included a waiver of his right to appeal, he filed this appeal. The government has moved to enforce the appeal waiver under *United States v. Hahn*, 359 F.3d 1315 (10th Cir. 2004) (en banc) (per curiam). Mr. Rodriguez, through his counsel, concedes that the appeal waiver bars the appeal and no exception set forth in *Hahn* applies.
