
AT&T Inc v. FCC Doc. 9



## RESPONDENT FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION'S RESPONSE TO AT&T'S MOTION FOR STAY

The Federal Communications Commission ("FCC" or "Commission") respectfully responds to the September 26, 2008 "Motion of AT&T Inc. for Stay Pending Judicial Review" ("Motion for Stay"). For the reasons set forth below, it is unnecessary for this Court to address AT&T's Motion for Stay.

On September 12, 2008, the Commission issued an Order<sup>1</sup> directing its Enforcement Bureau to release agency records requested by trade association CompTel under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552, as amended. On September 26, 2008, AT&T filed its Petition for Review of

that Order, and moved to stay the Commission's Order pending judicial review. The Commission has subsequently entered into an agreement with AT&T under which the Commission will not release the records at issue until a mandate issues from a decision of this Court in the above-captioned proceeding affirming the Commission's Order in whole or in part, or until the instant proceeding is otherwise resolved. AT&T has agreed to withdraw its Motion to Stay within one business day following the Commission's filing of this Response. In light of the foregoing, it is unnecessary for the Court to address AT&T's Motion for Stay.
