PER CURIAM:

John Furgess, Jr. appeals the district court's order adopting the report and recommendation of the magistrate judge and granting summary judgment in favor of United Parcel Service, Inc. on Furgess's claim of race discrimination under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000e to 2000e-17 (2000). We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. See Furgess v. United Parcel Service, Inc., No. 3:05-cv-01206-CMC (D.S.C. Nov. 1, 2006).
