## PER CURIAM:

Wayne Douglas Leneau appeals the district court's order accepting the recommendation of the magistrate judge and dismissing his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2006) complaint under 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2)(B)(ii) (2006). We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. See Leneau v. Aplin, No. 4:09-cv-00932-CMC (D.S.C. June 22, 2009). Further, we deny Leneau's motion for transcripts and copies at Government expense.
