## PER CURIAM:

Jennifer Coates appeals the district court's order granting summary judgment in favor of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore and individual defendants Kimberly Washington and Stephanie Rawlings-Blake in this employment discrimination action pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 ("Title VII"), 42 U.S.C. § 2000e-2000e-17 (West 2003 & Supp. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error.
