## PER CURIAM:

Christopher A. Wills appeals\* the district court's orders dismissing his civil action asserting claims under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2006) and Bivens v. Six Unknown Named Agents of Fed. Bureau of Narcotics, 403 U.S. 388 (1971), and denying his motion for reconsideration. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error.
