PER CURIAM:

William Timothy Kemph appeals the district court's orders dismissing without prejudice as legally frivolous his 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2006) complaint, see 28 U.S.C. §§ 1915A(b)(1), 1367(c) (2006), and denying his Fed. R. Civ. P. 59(e) motion. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. Kemph v. Brown, No. 7:12-cv-00430-GEC (W.D. Va. Nov. 8, 2012; Jan. 4, 2013). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
