PER CURIAM:

Minyard Cass Davis appeals the district court's order granting Defendants' Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(6) motions to dismiss and dismissing Davis' 42 U.S.C. § 1983 (2012) complaint for failure to state a claim. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. See Davis v. Watson, No. 2:15-cv-00146-RAJ-DEM (E.D. Va. Nov. 17, 2015).
