## PER CURIAM:

Norman Alan Kerr, a federal prisoner, appeals the district court's order adopting the recommendation of the magistrate judge and denying relief on his 28 U.S.C. § 2241 (2012) petition. We have reviewed the record and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the district court. Kerr v. Rogers, No. 5:16-cv-00278-MGL (D.S.C. Sept. 20, 2016). We deny Kerr's motion for a certificate of appealability as unnecessary and deny his motion for a transcript at government expense.
