PER CURIAM:

Moses Sebastian Obam Otiato, a native and citizen of Kenya, petitions for review of an order of the Board of Immigration Appeals (Board) dismissing his appeal from the Immigration Judge's decision denying his motion to reopen and rescind his *in absentia* removal order. We have reviewed the administrative record and the Board's order and find no abuse of discretion. *See* 8 C.F.R. § 1003.23(b) (2017). We therefore deny the petition for review for the reasons stated by the Board. *See In re Otiato* (B.I.A. July 17, 2017).
