PER CURIAM:

Cristina Gonzalez Bautista and her minor daughter, both natives and citizens of Mexico, petition for review of an order of the Board of Immigration Appeals (Board) dismissing their appeal from the Immigration Judge's decision denying Gonzalez Bautista's application for asylum and withholding of removal. We have considered Gonzalez Bautista's claims after thoroughly reviewing the record and conclude that the record evidence does not compel a ruling contrary to any of the agency's factual findings, *see* 8 U.S.C. § 1252(b)(4)(B) (2018), and that substantial evidence supports the Board's decision, *see INS v. Elias-Zacarias*, 502 U.S. 478, 481 (1992).

Accordingly, we deny the petition for review for the reasons stated by the Board. *See In re Gonzalez Bautista* (B.I.A. Feb. 12, 2019). We dispense with oral argument because the facts and legal contentions are adequately presented in the materials before this court and argument would not aid the decisional process.
